


Pennant banner template for 12x12 paper

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Paper scallop and burlap banner with free templates! Create a simple paper and fabric banner for any occasion - parties, birthdays, home decor! Banners are easy to make! I love making banners! They are perfect for every occasion. Birthdays, parties, decorations, etc. And the best thing about them is you can personalize them for any holiday too! There are so many beautiful note entries you can choose from. Then add a little fabric on your back and you have a really festive way to decorate. You can use any Fabric Way back in my early blogging days I wanted to create 100 burlap projects. I think I got to about 60 before I stopped. I thought about it the other day and I decided that I was going to make that goal. So this project uses a burlap! Burlap comes in lots of colors Now the good thing about working out with burlap now is that it comes in tons of cute colors! I used a bright turquoise burlap for this banner. You can use any paper you can also use any paper you want! I used my new Chasing Adventure paper for this banner! This is my newest line of Pebbles and it's all about getting out of your house and having an adventure. It's so colorful! Adding Scallop borders I added a simple border scallop at the top of the pennants to add a little extra to the draft. You can cut scallops with scallop scissors or with your craft cutting machine. Free Pennant Banner Patterns Click for free Banner templates I also created two pennant templates you can use to cut your paper and fabric! Just click on the link below to grab free templates! Customize the Banner for any occasion you can make this banner for as long as you need. If you use it to decorate shelves, you may not need to make as many pennants as you would if you use a banner to decorate a party or mantelpiece. How to make a scallop paper and fabric banner delivery: Fabric (1/2 yard or so) paper (the amount of paper depends on whether you want all the templates the same, or alternating, or each pennant of different paper printing. Hot glue and pistol narrow tape to tie pennants together (10 inches - 12 inches for each pennant) twine or ribbon on a string pennants together. Length depends on the type of project you use pennants for. Directions Decide how many pennants you need for your project. Print free templates in a card warehouse and cut them out. Trace a large pennant on the fabric (I used Track the little pennant on scraper paper. Cut scallops (it is optional)Layer each pennant - cloth, paper and scallop on top of each other. Use a hole kick to punch the hole on each side of each pennant. The thread is a very thin tape or or through the hole, around the back and back through the opposite hole. Tie in a knot or bow. Once all the pennants are collected, lay them out in the correct order and flip them over on your back. Put a twine or ribbon you want to string the banner together over the tops of the pennants. Fold each cloth over the string and hot glue it in place. Now you have a beautiful pennant to use! Save the templates and make the TIS banner over and over again with different fabrics and papers - the possibilities are endless! If you want to change its size, make sure you only adjust the image using an angle, so that you don't distort the shape when you change the size. Now you're ready to print the template. We print our templates on white cardboard so we can cut them out and use them to trace around on any patterned paper that we want to use. Continue reading this step-by-step article for ideas about using this free note template for pennants banners. Ludens For a start, we printed a free pennant template in three sizes so we could cut them out and try them on the note page to see which size would work best. In the end, we chose the smallest one, which allowed me to get 9 forms through the 8 1/2 x 11-inch note page. For the rest of the steps you will need: a pen to track the shape, sharp scissors to cut out the pieces, DMC thread or other fibers or strings, and glue. Ludens Once you have printed a free template on cardboard and cut it out, you can use it to carefully trace the shape over and over on the back of the cardboard or printed paper. As you can see, the shape is designed in such a way that it fits snugly next to each traceable shape allowing the pieces to nest together. Track as many pennant shapes as you need on one or more colors of cardboard or paper. For a sample note page, we alternated two different paper designs. Ludens Now it's time to cut the pieces. If you traced the pennant all tight together you will be able to cut them quickly using scissors or even a paper trimmer to cut straight lines, as shown in this photo. Ludens Now you want to fold each pennant shape very neatly all over the top so that the tab is folded on your back. To get a good crunchy time, you can carefully score the line first. We used a scoring blade on my paper trimmer to score a line through each and then folding with fast and perfect. Ludens The last step is to place the glue on the folded tab and fold each pennant on top of a piece of DMC thread. You want to pull the thread nicely nice Tightly through the crease on the pennant form so that the thread is at the very top of each flag. To stick to the completed pennant on the note page, you can add a piece of double-sided foam glue tape on the back of each piece. This will give you a banner to raise a little and add dimension to your note layout page. Ludence Hey Friends! Today I'm going to share with you a DIY paper Pennant Banner Tutorial to be used for a party or in your everyday decor! I created this paper banner for extra decor in the cozy reading corner of my daughters. This fun oatmeal took about 30 minutes to put together, with most of the materials I already had on hand (I ran to the dollar shop for a hole kick... LOL). You may notice these models from my Fashion Podge Wooden Letters Tutorial. This one packet of paper notes has lasted me several projects and can take on a few more (well worth \$8). Scrapbook Paper or Cardstock (actually any document of choice) String, Twine, or Yarn Hole Punch Penn Pattern (subscribe using the form below for a free PDF) Paper Cutter or Scissor Team Hooks Directions Step 1: Cut out the desired pennant and use a hole kick to cut small circles. For this tutorial I used a large triangle in my template. Track the pennant several times on a sheet of decorative piece of paper. Draw an X where the holes should go. Repeat this step if you use many sheets of paper. I used 4 pieces of paper from a paper pad note. Step 3: Cut the pennants with a paper cutter. I have a Fiskars Recycled 12-inch trimmer bypass (bought on Amazon). Having a paper cutter is such a time saver! It's worth a small investment if you're a cunning person (or you want to be a cunning person). Hit out of X's with a hole kick. Step 4: Determine how long you want your oatmeal and cut the string to that length. Stred the suspension. Knot ends with a loop at the end to hang step 5: Now you can decorate your banner or just hang it! I used clear mini-team hooks to hang this banner! These oatmeal are super customizable and easy to make! I have this banner hanging in the corner reading my girls. It's so adorable and matches their colorful decor perfectly! I can't wait to make more banners to match my seasonal decor. I hope this tutorial was easy to follow and will help you personalize your space in a fresh and creative way! What will you be choose any two-way cardboard/scrapbook paper-pencil-stapler-line Encounters:1. If you use scrap paper it came in 12x12. So, find the middle, and that will be your pennant point. Draw a line from point to opposite corner, and do it again on the other side, so you make a triangle. (it becomes your template) 2. Track the pattern on every paper you want to use. Then cut ... as much as you want3. Take a string and staple each pennant to the line. (You can use a pad for your hand, such as a mit oven :) Easier steamed turnips!!
